

Have a wonderful summer filled with great memories, health and fun!



## CURRICULUM CORNER



#### Summer Learning Experiences


Learning never takes a vacation! Included in this edition of our newsletter is information about the Summer Math Challenge, Summer Reading Challenge and a reasonably priced optional subscription to **Epic!** 

One of the best things that you can do for your child this summer is to encourage him/her to read! Research shows that many students suffer from summer reading loss when they return to school each fall. Researcher B. Heynes reports that "the single summer activity that is most strongly and consistently related to summer learning is reading." Summer is the perfect time to interest children in books! The public library offers a multitude of read-ing materials for children. Children should be encouraged to read not only books, but magazines, newspapers, maps, comic books – the possibilities are endless! Other research reports that reading four to five books during the summer is potentially enough to prevent a decline in reading achievement from spring to fall. This is an easy as well as inexpensive way to keep your child up to date with his/her school progress! Don't forget to have your child record the books that he/she reads this summer on the Governor's Reading Challenge form that will be sent home with your child in the coming days. These forms will be collected during the first week of school and the number of students who spent time reading during the summer will be reported to the Governor's office. Let's have Braeburn students at 100% participation this year!

Finally, let your child have fun this summer! Spending time outdoors, traveling, hiking, and trips to the park or the beach are all activities that build background knowledge for your child. Children with extensive background knowledge have an easier time making connections to the texts that they are required to read in school since they have had the experiences that the characters in a story may encounter. Expensive vacations are not the only experiences that build background knowledge! Children learn new things every day just by being careful observers of things that are in and around their own neighborhoods. A trip to the park with a friend can lead to a variety of details to write about upon returning to school, as is having an outdoor barbeque or catching fireflies in a glass jar on a warm summer evening. Getting children to create a picture in their mind prior to writing helps them to add detail to their writing. Reading and enjoying the great outdoors are two of the most important things that you can encourage your child to do this summer!

Have a wonderful summer! I look forward to our continued partnership in the fall!







#### Update on Privacy Law - Public Act 16-189

We believe that it is vital for all students in West Hartford Public Schools to be able to efficiently and effectively use digital tools that empower them in all phases of the learning process, including research, problem solving, content creation, communication, and collaboration. We also believe that we must be committed at all times to protecting students' privacy and providing them with a powerful and safe educational experience. To that end, the West Hartford Public Schools follow the legal requirements of Public Act 16-189 to promote the safety and security of all students and staff. In compliance with Connecticut State Law, we update online programs used within the district that house student data. The programs may be used district-wide, in a very small number of classrooms, or with individual students. The list will be updated each time the district enters into a new contract where student data is housed.
